THE ABC'S OF CHRISTMAS

EXPLANATION

A is for an angel (ahhh!), Gabriel, who began the story with a greeting: "Good evening! You're beautiful with God's beauty, Beautiful inside and out! God be with you!" Luke 1:28 *The Message*

B is for Bethlehem, where our story takes place. People traveled from far and wide to arrive in the city; it was a very busy place (*mumble under your breath*).

C is for a census [that's a counting of all the people] (**How many people here?**) the reason so many people filled the city of Bethlehem.

CAROL "O Little Town of Bethlehem" vs. 1 & 2 ELW No. 279

O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie! Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by; yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light. The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.

For Christ is born of Mary, and, gathered all above while mortals sleep, the angels keep their watch of wond'ring love. O morning stars, together proclaim the holy birth, and praises sing to God the king, and peace to all the earth!

D is for the donkey (hee-haw) that carried a family on their long journey to Bethlehem to be counted.

E is for exhausted (*take a deep breath*), that's how everyone felt when they arrived – tired from all the travelling.

F is for family (**you and me and baby makes three**): Mary and Joseph and their new baby Jesus, who was born that night in Bethlehem.
